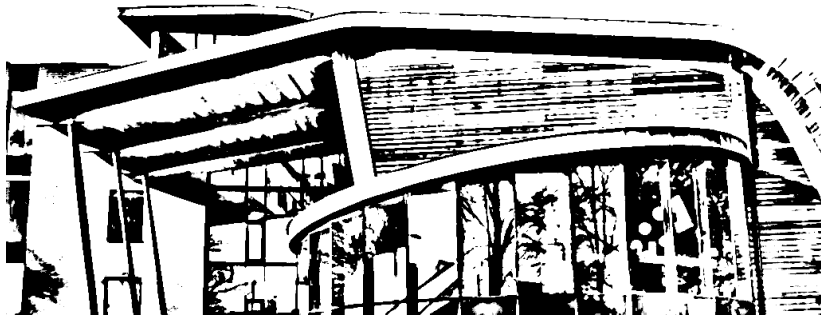

Online journal Updates

Springer Journals Now Available

The University has taken out a licence to all online Springer journals. This will provide access to 1,300 titles from 1997 to the present. Education titles included in this package are *Children's Literature in Education*, *Educational Studies in Mathematics*, *International*

Journal of Technology & Design Education, *International Review of Education*, *Social Psychology of Education* and *Studies in Philosophy & Education*.

English in Education Now Available Online

Due to a change in publisher, *English in Education* is now available online from 1997 (volume 31).

Studies in Science Education Now Available Online

This title is now available online from volume 1 (1974) to the present.

Two New Journals from Project Muse

The Journal of the History of Childhood & Youth and *The Journal of Film & Video* are both now available through Project Muse.

The first of these explores the development of childhood and youth cultures and the experiences of young people across diverse times and places. The journal publishes original articles based on empirical research and essays that place contemporary issues of childhood and youth in a historical context.

The Journal of Film & Video focuses on scholarship in the fields of film and video production, history, theory, criticism, and aesthetics. Article features include film and related media, problems of education in these fields, and the function of film and video in society.

New Databases

Periodicals Index Online (PIO)

The University has recently gained access to *Periodicals Index Online*. This is a database of millions of article citations

published in over 5,000 periodicals in the arts, humanities and social sciences, across more than 300 years. It can be accessed via the University Library's list of databases at <http://www.lib.cam.ac.uk/electronicresources/databases.html>

Intute

Intute is a free online service providing you with access to the very best Web resources for education and research. The service is created by a network of UK universities and partners. Subject specialists select and evaluate the websites in the database and write high quality descriptions of the resources. The database contains 121174 records and can be accessed via the Library webpages

Multiverse

This is funded by the Training and Development Agency for Schools and is aimed particularly at teacher educators and student teachers/trainees, but would also be useful for researchers. It provides access to a comprehensive range of resources (research reports, journal articles, book reviews, videos with transcripts,

websites, newspaper reports etc.) which focus on the educational achievement of pupils from diverse backgrounds. It is free to register and provides access to many full-text documents. It can be accessed via the Library webpages (<http://www.educ.cam.ac.uk/library/24hr/freelyavailable/fulltext/>)

This is the British Film Institute's website and part of the site is called the Education Zone, which contains lesson plans, downloadable resources, teaching tips etc. with the aim of supporting teachers in the teaching of a range of different subjects by means of film and television. Access to the moving image material is free and available to all UK schools, colleges, universities and public libraries. British Library Learning
