Submission of Paper Presentations

Abstracts should be no more than 500 words and biographies no more than 100. You should submit using the **EdDconf16 Paper-Poster-Symposium Proforma** which can be downloaded from the **Doctorate of Education Moodle VLE** site.

Presenters submitting an abstract for one of the **90-minute presentation panels** must submit final abstracts and bios by 1st of June. Papers will be presented on panels of 3-5 with 15 minute presentations followed by a Q&A.

The EdDconf16 committee (**Prof. Pam Burnard** (chair), **Dr. Tatjana Dragovic**, **Dr. Julie Alderton**, and **Dr. Richard Byers**) will complete reviews and notify you by 10th of June.

Submission of Posters

Research posters are usually A4 or A3 graphic presentations of an aspect (or aspects) of your EdD project(s) (e.g you might feature 2 or 3 elements as listed bullets for abstracts).

Proforma is the same as for paper submissions, with the difference that the abstract for a poster must be a maximum of 200 words, and biography no more than 50. Submission date is also the same as for papers.

Research Communities

Research communities are invited to each prepare a **30 minute presentation** which will form part of an **EdD Communities Symposium**. Submission date and proforma is the same as for paper submissions.
