Denmead has a forthcoming book with Duke University Press titled *Creative Underclass: Youth, Labor, and the 21st Century City.* This principally ethnographic book examines how creative city politics in one city mobilizes the look and feel of youth and creativity to gentrify neighbourhoods, and how this phenomenon produces paradoxical effects for young people of colour from working-class and low-income backgrounds. I serve on the editorial review board for *Art Education* and *Journal of Cultural Research in Art Education*. In 1997, he founded New Urban Arts, a youth arts collective for high school students and artists based in Providence, Rhode Island.
